#### Chipozo, Guatemala

The work to prepare for doing the final Phase of the Chipozo Solar-powered water pumping project in December continues at a rapid pace. Last week, the community team in Chipozo completed the clearing of the land where the solar panels will be situated and this week the CeCEP team, with the assistance of the community, is hard at work building the "caseta" at the location of the panels which will serve to both house the electrical system components as well as the community person who will provide 24/7 security for the system (left picture). Another recent accomplishment was construction by the community of a temporary water catchment system at the upper tank which will gather water to be used in the conduct of leak tests of the pipes between the tanks as well as the water distribution from the upper tank to the ten community tapstands. 

# PMEL -A Key to EWB Success (Newsletter Article Part 1)

engineering projects; its about delivering solutions. EWB is not about doing something for somebody; its about partnering with them to help them build a better life. EWB is not about building something that works when you start it up; its about building something a difference 10 or 20 years from now. PMEL is the operating philosophy / framework central to achieving our goals.

What is PMEL? This is the first of a series of articles to answer that question; introducing the framework and the system.

Our Planning, Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning system is tailored for student and professional chapters. At the 30,000' level it is a structured system to help us: develop true partnerships with the communities we work with; think through what we need to know; decide how we are going to get that information; plan our trips thoroughly, clearly, safely, and robustly; monitor the performance of our project and its impact on our partners' lives at the startup and years afterwards, evaluate what went well and what could have been done better; report our lessons learned to get rolled up into an EWB-USA-wide lessons learned database; learn individually from those lessons; and as an organization institute improvements to our system based on analysis of these lessons.

The data collected concerning the outcome of our work (impact on people's lives) that we collect before, at, and after implementation is rolled up so that EWB-USA has a cogent story to present to our donors and the U.N. An additional benefit of the PMEL framework is that it clearly documents all the project team's activities; for the working team, the team members to follow, and for reference by anyone in the EWB-USA organization.

She has worked with refugees and survivors of sexual assault and human trafficking.
